Course Description

The first part of the course intends to introduce the graduate student to “flow of funds” approach which describes the incentives and the organizational structure of the health care system. Also, the basic principles of insurance are presented because the financing of all healthcare systems is based on some type of insurance mechanism.

The second part of the course is dedicated to the presentation of the group health insurance arrangements as well as the innovative schemes of managed care.

The third part of the course analyses the three main types of healthcare provision systems by associating them with concrete national models: the British-type NHS for the UK; the National Health Insurance Model for France, and the Private Health Insurance Model for The Netherlands.

Special attention is given to the Greek Healthcare System.
